We refer to our previous disclosure dated May 12, 2016 relative to the case docketed as *“Jimmy S. Juntilla, Complainant, vs. Semirara Mining and Power Corporation and Victor A. Consunji, President, Respondents, NLRC Case No. RAB-XI-04-00269-16, National Labor Relations Commission, Regional Arbitration Branch No. XI, Davao City.”* Complainant Juntilla (“Juntilla” for brevity) is a Dump Truck Driver at Semirara Mining and Power Corporation’s (the “Company”) mine site in Semirara Island, Caluya, Antique. Juntilla alleged to have been illegally dismissed and now seeking separation pay from the Company. The Company, however, argued that the dismissal is for a valid cause.

Today, December 13, 2016, we received a copy of the Decision dated October 28, 2016 dismissing the complaint for lack of merit. Accordingly, the NLRC stated that “[a]ll things considered, amidst the flurry of claims and counterclaims by the contending parties, as established by the appreciated facts and evidence however, there is no doubt that respondents [the “Company”] have satisfactorily discharge the burden in proving that the complaint Juntilla’s dismissal was for a valid just cause and that the rudimentary requirements of due process was duly observed and complied with in effecting his termination from employment.”

The dispositive portion of the said Decision is hereto reproduced, as follows:

“WHEREFORE, FOREGOING PREMISES CONSIDERED, judgment is hereby rendered **DISMISSING** the case for lack of merit.”
